



Crochet Star Pattern 1

You will need

Worsted weight yarn in pink or white if possible, but any colour if you have an old stash of yarn.

Crochet Hook: IMiscellaneous: yarn needle for weaving in ends.

Directions

With I hook and yarn, start with a magic circle of 5 sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 5 sc sts), join and pull closed. (5sts)

Ch 1, 2 sc in each stitch to end of round, sl st to join. (10sts)

Ch 1, hdc, 2 hdc in next st, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (15 sts)

ch5, sc in 2nd ch from hook, (working down the ch 5) sc, hdc, dc, sk 1 sc on circle, sl st 2, repeat to end of round.

sc 4, ch 2 (at tip of star point), sc 4, sc2tog (between two points), repeat to end of round.

sc 4, 3hdc in ch 2 space, sc 4, sl st (between two points), repeat to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends.

If you intend to sell your stars please add a pin. Otherwise we will have pins available for them.

RM's Twinkle

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This pattern is written in UK [US] terms

Materials

- Suitable for any yarn
- Increase recommended hook size
- Scissors
- Sewing needle

Stitches

- MC magic circle
- Tr [dc] treble crochet [double crochet]
- Ch chain
- Sl st slip stitch

Popcorn stitch

- Work 5 tr [dc] in the MC or the chain 4 circle
- Pull up the loop of the last stitch and remove the hook
- Insert the hook from the front under the top loops of the first tr [dc] worked
- Pull the loop from the last tr [dc], back through the first tr [dc]
- Close the popcorn with a ch 2

Rounds

1. Use MC or make a circle by ch 4 and close with a sl st
2. Work 5 popcorns into the MC or circle, close the MC with a sl st into top of 1st popcorn
3. *(3 tr [dc] in the ch 2 space, ch 3, 3 tr [dc] in the same ch 2 space; sl st into top of popcorn)* repeat from * to * 5 times

Finish off, sew in ends and decorate
